New records in ArchivesSearch

Rates and Valuations

Queensland State Archives (QSA) has recently received a transfer of rate books and valuation registers from Toowoomba City Council and its predecessors, Middle Ridge, Drayton, Newtown and Gowrie Shire Councils. The records date from 1861 to 1949.

Rate books and valuation registers contain details about owners and occupiers of a property, improvements such as building and the valuation of the property. They are a valuable resource for researchers of family and local history, as they can be used to trace people's movements as well as the history of the buildings.

When using these registers, start with what information you definitely know and work your way back. There are no indexes for any of these registers and each entry will have to be scanned.
